From Pastor Ryan...

"So Pilate delivered Jesus over to them to be crucified... And He went out, bearing His own cross, to the place called The Place of the Skull... There they crucified Him..." (John 19:16-18)

"Surely, He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrow... He was pierced for our transgressions; He was crushed for our iniquities; Upon Him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with His wounds we are healed... The Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all." (Isaiah 53:4-6)

Lent has a beautiful and rich history. From as early as AD 339, the Christian Church had been using the 40 days before Easter as a time of repentance, fasting, and prayer. Ash Wednesday, the start of Lent, is often typified with ashes – a biblical symbol of repentance and grief – being placed on the forehead of those who confessed and repented of their sins. Job sat among the ashes as he mourned, the Ninevites put on sackcloth and ashes when they repented at Jonah's preaching, and others throughout Scripture used ashes as a sign of grief and repentance (Abraham in Genesis 18:27, Tamar in 2 Samuel 13:19, Daniel in Daniel 9:3, among others.) During Lent, we are often encouraged to "give up" something as we observe Lent. Maybe it's a certain food or drink or habit. Instead of engaging in those things, then, we are to spend that time in repentant prayer to the Lord.

Lent is also a time of preparation. Lent helps us to prepare for the events of Holy Week. Rather than just blindly stumbling into Good Friday & Easter, Lent gives us a time to prepare – mentally, emotionally, and spiritually – for those important days.

As we observe Lent at Maranatha this year, we are going through two Lenten series. On Wednesday evenings, we are looking at the seven I AM statements that Jesus made and have been recorded for us in John's Gospel. In these sayings, Jesus takes and applies the Divine Name of God to Himself (and nearly gets killed for it), as well as letting us deeply see His character and nature.

Then, on Sunday mornings, we turn to John's Revelation of Jesus Christ as we study the Seven Letters to the Seven Churches of Asia in Revelation 2 & 3. In each of these letters, Jesus gives us a beautiful picture of who He is and gives His people a call to repentance.

The goal of both of these series is to remind our hearts, our souls, our minds of the sacrifice that Jesus Christ made on our behalf. As we observe Lent, we do so humbly, remembering that it was *our* sin that Jesus died for.

Jacobus Revius was a Dutch poet, Calvinist theologian, and church historian. Relatively unknown and unread during his days, in recent years, his works - especially some of his poems - have become more widely read. I recently came across one of his poems that focus on the crucifixion of our Lord. It's a beautiful poem that helps prepare our hearts and minds for the sacrifice that Jesus made for me and for you.

I am the one, O Lord, who brought you there, I am the heavy cross you had to bear, I am the rope that bound you to the tree, The whip, the nail, the hammer, and the spear, The blood-stained crown of thorns you had to wear: It was my sin, alas, it was for me.

Prayers for our Soldiers


