

FROM PASTOR LLOYD...

Dear Folks at Maranatha,

It could be tough to plant our potatoes on Good Friday this year! It may not look like it outside, but Holy Week is almost upon us. And we have much to celebrate in spite of the lingering winter, in spite of disturbing news around us each day, and in spite of challenges we may be facing in our personal lives. **If we know Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior, we are overcomers!** And as long as we continue to trust in Him, no weather, no news, nor any difficulty can defeat us. Not even death itself!

My earthly father has been gone from this life almost 27 years now, but one of my more vivid memories of him was of hearing him pray. He prayed in kind of a King James English, and used a few words I was not used to using. He would typically end his prayers, even when praying with our family, by asking forgiveness of his sins and “shortcomings.” And then he would pray that he would “overcome.”

You may have noticed in the letters to the seven churches in the book of Revelation (which we have been preaching through during Lent at Maranatha, Glyndon) some form of that word “overcome” comes up a lot! The ending of each of the letters includes a word “*to him who overcomes....*” To “overcome” is to conquer, to gain victory in spite of obstacles.

The Bible reveals to us that Jesus Christ, through His death on the cross and resurrection from the grave, gained the victory over sin, death, and the power of the devil. And so, as long as we personally believe in Jesus, we share in His victory. *For whatever is born of God overcomes the world; and this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith. Who is the one who overcomes the world, but he who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?* (1 John 5:4-5)

My dad was praying for the Lord to keep him in the faith until the end, and his faith in Jesus remained strong till his last breath. As we celebrate Jesus Christ’s death and resurrection this next week, may we be encouraged by all of the things that are ours in eternity, if we too remain trusting in Jesus to the end of our earthly lives! Below are the “words to overcomers” from the letters to the seven churches in Revelation 2 & 3:

Ephesus - *To him who overcomes, I will grant to eat of the tree of life which is in the Paradise of God.* Heaven will be paradise restored!

Smyrna - *He who overcomes will not be hurt by the second death.* We all can expect to die the first death someday, but we need not fear the second death which is the lake of fire, because we stand before our judge in the righteousness of Christ.

Pergamum - *To him who overcomes, to him I will give some of the hidden manna, and I will give him a white stone, and a new name written on the stone which no one knows but he who receives it.* In Christ we have been given the ticket to the great banquet feast in Heaven!

Thyatira - *He who overcomes, and he who keeps My deeds until the end, to him I will give authority over the nations; and I will give him the morning star.* We will share with Christ in judging the nations.

Sardis - *He who overcomes* will thus be clothed in white garments; and I will not erase his name from the book of life, and I will confess his name before My Father and before His angels. We will stand before God in the righteousness of Christ, with our names written in the book of life, and Jesus declaring each name before the Father and His angels!

Philadelphia - *He who overcomes*, I will make him a pillar in the temple of My God, and he will not go out from it anymore; and I will write on him the name of My God, and the name of the city of My God, the new Jerusalem, which comes down out of heaven from My God, and My new name. We will stand securely at last in the presence of the Lord and in the awesome heavenly Jerusalem!

Laodicea - *He who overcomes*, I will grant to him to sit down with Me on My throne, as I also overcame and sat down with My Father on His throne. Jesus' sinless life and sacrificial death earned Him to be exalted to His throne in Heaven and earned for us to join Him there!

Revelation later also tells us this: *These will wage war against the Lamb, and the Lamb will overcome them, because He is Lord of lords and King of kings, and those who are with Him are the called and chosen and faithful.* (Revelation 17:14)

And so, as we meet together during Holy Week, we celebrate the victory that is ours in Jesus Christ.
