FROM PASTOR PETER...

Years ago, I was privileged to witness the reunion of two men wounded in battle ten days earlier, who were recovering in the hospital. Although invited, I felt myself an unqualified intruder to a sacred moment only the two of them could know. While I could rejoice with them in the reunion, I could not fully appreciate the magnitude of its significance. I had not experienced or witnessed all that had transpired prior to and during the events leading up to their hospital reunion.

How Easter morning is celebrated can be similar in many ways. A common mistake is to regard Easter as a national holiday, albeit a special one. Easter should never be recognized within the confines of a 24-hour day. Easter is not a stand-alone event, like some regard the 4th of July or even Christmas. Only those born again in Christ can celebrate Easter. All others are like me in that hospital room watching two broken men reunited by the grace of God working through those who saved them in battle. Such folks are glad Easter happened but not with unbridled joy.

We are prepared for Easter when we have come to terms with all that transpired before that wonderful morning. Good Friday Services with the sobering reality of what Jesus Christ willingly gave Himself to face and suffer on our behalf tune our hearts to sing His grace. A prolonged visit to Isaiah 53 conditions the heart to the wonder of God's will and plan, what Jesus went through and fulfilled, ending in the finality of His death as defined in human terms only to be defied by His resurrection.

Even though we have the vantage point of history along with the testimony of the New Testament, Easter should always be greeted with the same sense of wonderment as expressed by those first to lay eyes on the empty tomb and resurrected Jesus.

“When they had heard that He was alive and had been seen by her, they refused to believe it.”

Mark 16:11 NASB

Sunday's news was just too much to digest after all that they had seen on Friday. Like those disciples, may we too be held in such amazement that we can hardly believe it. While some refuse to believe in the resurrection, to be caught in disbelief by the awe of Christ's rising from the dead is something far different. Charles Wesley's hymn, And Can It Be That I Should Gain expresses that same kind of bewildered belief of what Jesus gave up so that we would gain. The resurrected Jesus changes everything. Would our celebration of Easter have the same breathlessness of unfettered awe - HE IS ALIVE!

Our wonder of Easter morning today can be the same wonder as Christ's resurrection morning. His suffering was to be your suffering. His death was your death. His resurrection is your resurrection. His victory is your victory... **“but thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.”** (1 Corinthians 15:57)

Easter morning is your morning. It belongs to you in Christ. Celebrate it unashamedly.

Old Business – None

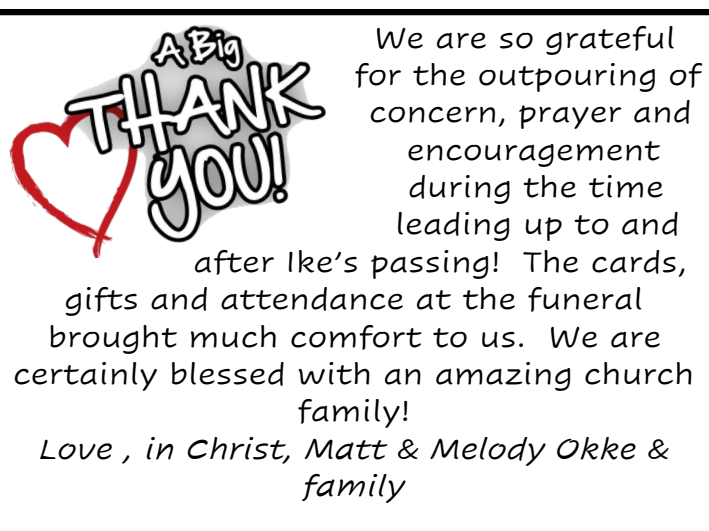
New Business –

SERVING GROUP 1 - Glyndon

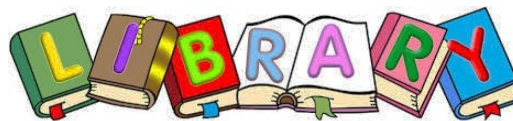

22. Every day, find time to be alone.
23. Having problems? Talk to God on the spot. Try to nip small problems in the bud. Don't wait until it's time to go to bed to try and pray.
24. Make friends with Godly people.
25. Keep a folder of favorite scriptures on hand.
26. Remember that the shortest bridge between despair and hope is often a good "Thank you Jesus."
27. Laugh
28. Laugh some more!
29. Take your work seriously, but not yourself at all.
30. Develop a forgiving attitude (most people are doing the best they can).
