FROM PASTOR LLOYD...

Your eyes have seen my unformed substance; and in Your book were all written, the days that were ordained for me, when as yet there was not one of them. (Psalm 139:16)

Let the favor of the Lord our God be upon us; and confirm for us the work of our hands;
yes, confirm the work of our hands. (Psalm 90:12 & 17)*

Dear friends at Maranatha,

The sign says: "Opening March 1st!" As I write this, the countdown of days is on until the downtown Moorhead Dairy Queen opens! Locally this serves as one of the symbolic signs of spring. And I suspect that many of you, like me, are feeling quite ready for that. Yes, I know we could have another month of winter in March, but after the recent winter weather, we will grasp at any potential signs that this long season is almost over!

We count down days to various other things that we anticipate as well. 4 more days until the weekend. 60 more days until someone's graduation. 120 more days until someone's wedding. Numbering the days left leading up to whatever it was that we are looking forward to.


The above Scriptures encourage us to number our days in a different way as well. Realizing that we have a limited number of days to live on this earth, we are encouraged to live them wisely, and make them count for the things that matter most.

This past weekend, I had the honor of preaching at a funeral for a cousin whom I grew up with, who was only three months older than I. Preparing to speak for that event resulted in a good bit of reflection on the impact of that cousin's life on me and many other folks as well. The Lord led our lives down similar paths through years of schooling. He was in the class above me in high school, and I ended up following him to Bible School in Mpls., then living in a house with him and other guys in college at MSUM, and then attending Free Lutheran Seminary together as well. In some respects, he paved the way for me to navigate some of the challenges that accompanied those years of schooling, which also set me on a course for the last 36 years of Pastoral Ministry. I am thankful for his significant influence on my life.

As I look ahead, I can't help but wonder, how many years I have left on this earth. The verses above remind me that the Lord knows the number of our days before we are even born. And we are encouraged to number our days. Not literally counting how many we have lived thus far, nor counting down how many we have left, but rather living them wisely, in light of not knowing the number we will get.

As we meditate during Lent on the Psalms connected to Jesus, may it be a valuable time for each of us to reflect on our lives and to let God's Word remind us of what is most important in life - Our daily walk with God and our relationships with other people. A lot of other things necessarily consume our hours and our days, but by God's grace may those be our highest priorities. Someday, someone may be reflecting back on how our life influenced theirs and encouraged them to live for the Lord.

Vice-President, Chad Johnson, called the meeting to order.

We sang the Hymn, *“To God Be the Glory.”* Chad opened with Phil. 4:6-7. Such humbling verses to think about as we consider that Paul proclaimed these verses while in prison, we too can *“Be anxious for nothing but in everything by prayer and supplication let our requests be made known unto to God.”*

The secretary’s report from the congregational meeting on November 19, 2025, was read by Chanyce Dahl. There were no corrections or additions, stands approved as read.

Treasurer’s report was given by Kristine Quanbeck. Contributions for the year were \$346,457, expenditures were \$307,593. General Fund year-end balance was \$89,450. The 2026 proposed budget is \$401,003.56, that is an increase of 5.4%, \$33,416 is needed monthly to fulfill this proposed budget. Treasure’s report was approved as read.

Pastor Quanbeck gave his report. Special welcome was given to Josh & Katie Johnson. Nikki will change her hours from 20 hours a week to 15. The congregation was encouraged to think about attending the annual conference this year which will be held in Fargo.

- There were few changes in the budget. Approximately 11% of our contributions are done electronically.

Trustees – Jeff Ehrichs

- Special thank you to Jack Olek for keeping the lawn and snow removal done on the property.
- Trustees will be installing handicap buttons on the front church doors.

Board of Education – Rochelle Olson

- Approximately 20 students attend Sunday school, the Christmas program was held in the evening this year.
- Cory and Rachel Trick have been leading the kids club program on Wednesday evenings. They have gone back to the old WINGS program. 10-15 kids attend.
- VBS dates are TBD

Worship – Lori Pender

- Thank you to everyone who helped with the children’s Christmas gifts through UC Hope.
- Last year the board did a flower display with purchased flowers from the congregation for Easter. The plan is to do that again this year. Orders for flowers must be in by Feb. 22.

Deacons – Glenn Urlacher

- One of the highlights of the year was going through the Not Beyond Reach program and now going through the Truth Rising study in the Adult Sunday School class.
- Deacon’s retreat is coming up; congregation was encouraged to share any thoughts or ideas with the board before they meet.

- All monies are accounted for. It was requested that all time cards be signed off on.



“Was his pillow wet where he laid his head?”


With the eyes of an innocent child,

A lie has speed, but truth has endurance.


The most important lesson in life is simply this: never hurry anybody.
