

FROM PASTOR PETER...

If I profess with the loudest voice and clearest exposition every portion of the truth of God except precisely that little point which the world and the devil are at that moment attacking, I am not confessing Christ, however boldly I may be professing Christ. Where the battle rages, there the loyalty of the soldier is proved. And to be steady on all the battle-field besides, is mere flight and disgrace if he flinches at that point.

Martin Luther

We all want our say in matters don't we. Eventually some people find comfort in surrendering to the wisdom of God in our lives. Ultimately who do we try to appease? Who does God want to with His actions and Word...me, you, or someone else you know? The answer should be obvious. What then does this say about the message of the church?

God was well-pleased through the foolishness of the message preached to save those who believe. For indeed Jews ask for signs, and Greeks search for wisdom; **but we preach Christ crucified**, to Jews a stumbling block, and to Gentiles foolishness, (1 Corinthians 1:21b-23 NASB)

The church and her people seeking to be faithful to the victorious Jesus and to be true to the will of God must be intentional and ever watchful to the ministry of its pulpit and its teaching. The focal point of its preaching must be... we preach Christ crucified. For integrity's sake the church must be obvious in its devotion to preach Christ crucified with full knowledge of the consequences. There is the spiritual battle inherent to the Gospel because the message of Christ crucified has its opponents... For indeed Jews ask for signs, and Greeks search for wisdom.

The entire church has to have discipline to *preach Christ crucified*. That the church is offering a message of hope for the sinful things the culture accepts, is hard to hear. The devil and the world always want to dictate the subject matter of the church's foolish message of Christ and His cross. Some folk express their displeasure with the church's message with their feet.

The preaching of *Christ crucified* gave rise to the church (Acts 20:28). Preaching *Christ crucified* builds His church. It grows on the Good News of Christ crucified, and as the old adage states, "watered by the blood of the martyrs." It is a bold congregation who expects Christ crucified in its message.

We're reminded why preachers must never hold back the message of the cross. The Law awakens the heart, but it will never convert it. The Law will bruise and crush a soul, but it will never console it. The Law will hammer away at the wayward will of man but will not change it. No, only the Gospel of Christ is the power of God for salvation (Romans 1:16). Certainly, the whole counsel of God is to be proclaimed and taught. Is God not pleased, when, to the glory of His Son and for the well-being of His children that Sunday after Sunday we hear the man of the pulpit *preach Christ crucified*.

The preaching of Christ crucified to those who are the called is not only a life-giving power, but also a life living power. Christ crucified becomes the way of life. Christ crucified is the power of God for this earthly life unto eternal life. Christ crucified is the wisdom of God for His people to live life. Christ crucified is intimately practical for the true believer. We don't live life on our own...by our own. Through the Gospel message we are transformed by the renewing of our mind. As the passengers flying in an airliner depend upon the constant provision of pressurized air flowing into the cabin, so too

believers are dependent upon the constant life-giving flow of God's power and wisdom through the preaching of Christ crucified.
