## FROM PASTOR RYAN...

Then Judah said to his brothers, "...Come, let us sell Joseph to the Ishmaelites, and let not our hand be upon him, for he is our brother, our own flesh." And his brothers listened to him... And they drew Joseph up and lifted him out of the pit, and sold him to the Ishmaelites for twenty shekels of silver. They took Joseph to Egypt. (Genesis 37:26-28 ESV)

I'll admit it: the narrative of Joseph being sold into slavery by his brothers seems like an odd place to begin an article for the Advent and Christmas seasons. Yet, as we covered this true story in our 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Bible Overview Confirmation Class lately, I was struck with the reoccurrence of a theme we typically associate with Christmas. See if you can catch it as we go through this narrative. (I'm gonna pick and choose some verses, but if you would like to follow along in Genesis 39 and read the full context, go right ahead!

Genesis 39:1-2 - Now Joseph had been brought down to Egypt, and Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh, the captain of the guard, an Egyptian, had bought him from the Ishmaelites who had brought him down there. The LORD was with Joseph, and he became a successful man.

In the next handful of verses, we're told how Joseph rose through the ranks of Potiphar's other slaves to become the house overseer, in charge of everything associated with Potiphar – whether it was in the house or in the field. Joesph made all those decisions and Potiphar "had no concern about anything, other than the food he ate" (Gen 39:6). Potiphar's house prospered as a result.

Everything was going good for Joseph – until it wasn't. Potiphar's wife tried to seduce Joseph and, when Joseph refused her advances, she accused him of inappropriate sexual conduct. Joseph is quickly thrown in prison by Potiphar – and it's probably a minor miracle that he wasn't killed on the spot. Yet, even in prison, Joseph's character and leadership had a chance to shine. As a result, the prison warden put Joseph in charge.

Genesis 39:21-23 – But the LORD was with Joseph and showed him steadfast love and gave him favor in the sight of the keeper of the prison. And the keeper of the prison put Joseph in charge of all the prisoners who were in the prison. Whatever was done there, he was the one who did it. The keeper of the prison paid no attention to anything that was in Joseph's charge, because the LORD was with him. And whatever he did, the LORD made it succeed.

I hope you caught the Christmas theme in these verses. The key to this narrative isn't Joseph's rags-to-riches ascents nor his moral fiber nor his great leadership skills. The theme of these verses is the Lord's presence in Joseph's enslavement and his imprisonment. "The Lord was with Joseph."

The theme of the Lord being with His people is what Christmas is truly about. In theological terms, we call this Jesus' *incarnation*. The word "incarnation" is a term that comes to us from Latin. It means "in flesh." The One and Only Son of God put on human flesh and became man.

Matthew 1:20-23 - An angel of the Lord appeared to [Joseph] in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us).

Immanuel. God with us. In Genesis 39, the Lord was with Joseph in a real way – but it was only a spiritual reality. In the person of Jesus, the Word became flesh and dwelt among us. In Jesus, God was with His people.

Even though the physical incarnation of Jesus Christ ended with His ascension into Heaven, Immanuel is still present with His people. Jesus promised us that "where two or three are gathered in My name, there am I among them" (Matthew 18:20) and that He is with us always, even to the end of the age (Matthew 28:20).

As we enter these seasons of Advent and Christmas, may we remember Jesus, our Immanuel, who is always present with us. Amen.
