

FROM PASTOR PETER...

The Church of the Risen Christ

Acts 20:28

While the sun was rising over the garden of Christ's tomb, the new dawn was soon to shine hope into humanity (1 Peter 1:3). Soon, in the sense that man's ears and eyes were but minutes away from the unprecedented news that Christ "has risen". Soon, the Christ who had died for the sins of all on the Cross of Calvary would be heralded as the risen Victor over sin and death. We celebrated that again on Easter morning in our hearts and in our churches.

It is good to have a church to call your own, to have a sense of welcome and belonging. A church to which you yourself offer the welcoming hand of Christ. A church with whom you joyfully and corporately worship your risen Savior. A church who misses you if you miss showing up one Sunday. A church to enjoy common fellowship because of the Savior. A church to whom you can extend your heart and hand of fellowship. A church to have your faith nurtured. A church for you to nurture others. A church who loves you in the risen Christ. A church upon whom you can pour out your love. Here on the leeward side of Easter, it's good for us to remember when Christ rose that Easter morn so too was the dawn of the church.

We often refer to what the church is, but more appropriately we should speak of who the church is. So who is it? It is the purchase of God. At the Cross, God paid the purchase for the community of forgiven sinners, His church...

...the church of God which He purchased with His own blood.

Acts 20:28

What an overwhelming wave of grace floods the soul when trying to comprehend this truth. We did not come cheap. We may not fully comprehend it but we should bask in the reality of this truth - *the Church of God which He purchased with His own blood*. This truth should erase any lingering doubt of who it was that was nailed on the Cross in the Person of Jesus Christ. God! His own blood is His gracious means by which man can measure His love for sinners. The church was born of His blood and nothing else. When the blood of Christ flowed down Calvary's Cross, His church was purchased.

Recognizing it was God's own blood, we should also acknowledge:

His ownership of your church. By His purchase, rightful ownership of the church is His. The magnitude of its cost should discourage anyone making the claim of having ownership of a church. It is cost prohibitive. Church ownership demands the life of the owner. While we may have purchased the property, the Lord bought the church.

His authority over your church. His blood shed by His own choice makes the resurrected Jesus the authority over your church. He holds that authority over His church through His Word. Human endeavors to establish human authoritative structures over the church is the very tyranny which Luther and other reformers opposed. Elected positions of leadership in the church have no authority except what is given under His Word. Offices of leadership are positions of servanthood for the sake of His church.

His expectation of your church. Jesus said He came not to be served but to serve. Although some liken the church to be a hospital for souls, it is a place of service for all. Rather than beds there are pews where His gospel word is heard, and His means of grace administered for needy souls. By these means He restores troubled, broken hearts into service. As rehab draws a patient from the hospital bed, the Lord restores souls with grace to serve.

While no congregation is perfect, it is still the bride of Christ. She is to be respected and spoken well of, in spite of her shortcomings and imperfections in the eyes of man. But in the eyes of God, she is holy and beyond reproach. May we be thankful to the Lord for bringing us into His church.
